










## NEXT WEEK AT THE COLOUR BOX



The Early Years Foundation Stage (national framework for the early years) requires that settings provide children with 'opportunities to develop and improve their skills in counting, understanding and using numbers, calculating simple addition and subtraction problems; and to describe shapes, spaces, and measures'

Learning and development is about providing a range of activities and resources that support children's individual needs. Focus on maths by looking at **shape**, **space** and **measure** with imaginative play. Develop an understanding of maths in the EYFS through stories, songs and games.
