These are only a few of the amazing things mentioned during our Volcano Project where we practised our language skills (understanding of simple concepts, following instructions, asking questions) and problem solving skills. We made the volcano from scratch using papiermache, painted it, watched a two minute documentary about volcanic eruptions, and finally we watched the explosion while listening to real volcanic sounds to have a complete sensorial experience. Wow!!! Our first STEM activity was a huge success in terms of learning, working as a team, raising questions "what happens to lava when it runs into the water?" "what are these black stones?" "can the airplanes flight over it?" "can we see through the smoke if we have special glasses?" "the lave is so hot we would get burned if we were there".

Inspired by one's of our children's wonderful "shopping building" construction that initiated great conversations in the class, we are going to explore London's famous building landmarks focusing on shapes. We will get to know a little bit about our unique city and its buildings, from the Shard and Buckingham Palace to London Bridge and the Gherkin. We will try to make our City display, use blocks to create 3D constructions, talk about our personal experiences around the city, practice our fine motor skills (cutting, mark-making) and promote our understanding of shapes and mathematical concepts (size comparison, tall, short, round and more).
